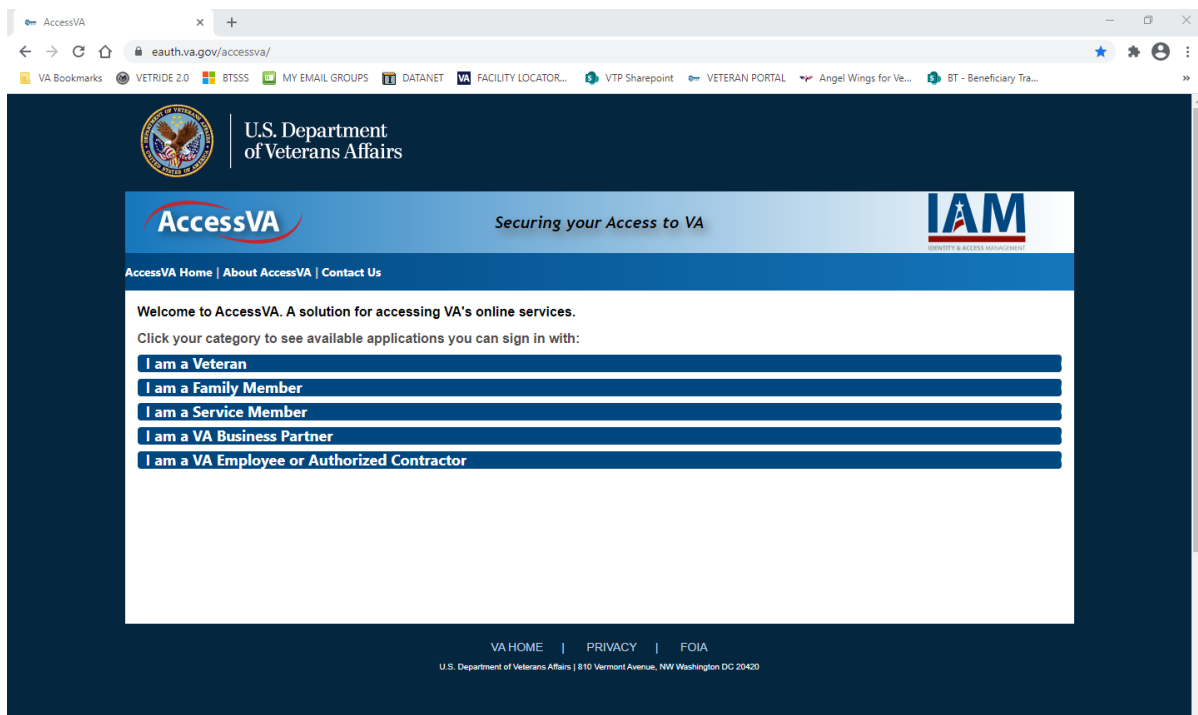
The new BTSSS gives Veterans:

- The ability to submit online 24/7, 365 days a year
- The ability to track the status of your claim
- The ability to reduce processing time for claims
- The ability to use self-help tools to make claims submissions fast and easy
